Dune Action along Rainbow Beach

Along with local residents, BHPA continues to monitor and provide photographic evidence of the changes caused by seepage along the section of dune adjacent to the Sewerage Treatment Plant. Erosion is increasing. An apparent blockage in the effluent disposal trench has been discovered and will be rectified immediately. But the eventual aim will be to minimise the amount of effluent flowing to the trench.
